First infection on plum twigs May 29, Chisago County. Blossom blight was serious. The dry weather seemed to check the disease and not much was found after the latter part of July. (Stakman). In Oregon, Barss reported that the dry summer and picking season lessened the amount of brown rot, and that the losses were lower than in 1920, when constant rain through September cracked the prune fruit and favored infection. Self-boiled lime sulphur and atomic sulphur held brown rot in check on plums in Georgia, according to hmClintock; and in Michigan, Dutton of the Department of Horticulture, Michigan Agricultural College, secured improved keeping quality of harvested plums by dusting the fruit, with sulphur about...
